Program Introduction			
<p>The Bachelor of Science in Human Resource Management (BSHRM) degree is designed to provide graduates with the knowledge and skills needed for careers in the large and growing human resource field. This degree provides students with a strong business background and an in-depth knowledge of the Human Resource Management discipline. The Bachelor of Science in Human Resource Management degree teaches practical skills across HR disciplines including staffing, training, HR information systems, benefits, global HRM and more. All courses are case based and application based.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A diploma from an accredited or state approved high school or its equivalent; A minimum GPA of 2.0 in all high school coursework; Proof of English proficiency (international students only). A minimum GPA of 2.0 in all transferable coursework. 			
Degree Requirements			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Total Semester Hours</u>: Undergraduate students are required to earn a minimum of 120 semester hours to be eligible to graduate from Trident University International. Some programs may require more units. <u>Residency</u>: Students must complete a minimum of 30 semester hours at Trident University International. <u>Upper Division Course Requirement</u>: Students must complete a minimum of 36 semester hours of coursework at the 300 and 400 levels. <u>General Education Program</u>: Students must complete the General Education Program requirements as stated in the catalog. <u>Academic Program</u>: Students must also satisfy all requirements of the individual program. <u>Minimum Grade</u>: Students must receive a minimum grade of "D" in undergraduate coursework taken at Trident. <u>Capstone Grade</u>: Students must receive a minimum grade of "C" in the undergraduate program capstone course. <u>Grade Point Average Requirement</u>: Students must receive a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all undergraduate coursework taken at Trident.
