Bachelor of Science in Homeland Security – Cyber Security (BS-HLS-CS)			
<b>Degree Objective</b>			
Trident University’s College of Health and Human Services offers the Bachelor of Science in Homeland Security (BSHLS) degree program. This program is sequentially constructed to correspond to “four pillars” of the National Preparedness Goal (2011) and the Missions of the Strategic Plan of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) (2012). The pillars are: (1) Prevent, (2) Protect, (3) Respond, and (4) Recover. This coverage format will ensure that all essential areas are addressed so that learners will be assured fundamental coverage of the Homeland Security scope of responsibilities. Courses will include scenarios and disaster simulation exercises to provide a sense of realism. The program begins with exploring the fundamentals and ethics of HLS, moves to interagency planning, and ultimately ends with the Capstone Course in which the student will submit original work that will reflect an integration of all coursework topics.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A diploma from an accredited or state approved high school or its equivalent;</li> <li>• A minimum GPA of 2.0 in all high school coursework;</li> <li>• Proof of English proficiency (international students only).</li> <li>• A minimum GPA of 2.0 in all transferable coursework.</li> </ul>			
<b>Degree Requirements</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Total Credits</u>: Undergraduate students are required to earn a minimum of 120 semester credit hours to be eligible to graduate from Trident University International. Some programs may require more units.</li> <li>• <u>Residency</u>: Students must complete a minimum of 30 semester credit hours at Trident University International.</li> <li>• <u>Upper Division Course Requirement</u>: Students must complete a minimum of 36 semester credit hours of coursework at the 300 and 400 levels.</li> <li>• <u>General Education Program</u>: Students must complete the General Education Program requirements as stated in the catalog.</li> <li>• <u>Academic Program</u>: Students must also satisfy all requirements of the individual program.</li> <li>• <u>Minimum Grade</u>: Students must receive a minimum grade of “D” in undergraduate coursework taken at Trident.</li> <li>• <u>Capstone Grade</u>: Students must receive a minimum grade of “C” in the undergraduate program capstone course.</li> <li>• <u>Grade Point Average Requirement</u>: Students must receive a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all undergraduate coursework taken at Trident.</li> </ul>			
<b>Transfer Policy</b>			
Credits are considered for transfer from any regionally or nationally accredited college or university as well as The American Council on Education (ACE), College Level Examination Program (CLEP), The DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DSST/DANTES), The Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL), and Excelsior, and other non-traditional forms of learning as deemed appropriate by College Deans or designees.
