Program Overview

The College of Business Administration offers the Doctor of Philosophy in Business Administration (Ph.D. BA) degree with a variety of concentrations. The Ph.D. curriculum has the following components:

You are required to take a total of 10 core courses including the dissertation proposal seminar (DBA 699). The courses include research methods, theory, and concentration courses and the dissertation proposal seminar. Three additional courses focus on dissertation work (DBA 700-702). All courses are four semester credits.

Note: Students are required to purchase IBM SPSS Statistical Software for the quantitative research courses and dissertation research.

Concentrations

The College of Business Administration offers the Doctor of Philosophy in Business Administration (Ph.D. BA) degree with five concentrations and a no concentration option. Students must select one concentration when they enroll into the program. The area of concentration must be chosen considering the student's area of research interest and expertise.

Comprehensive Exam

You will show a synthesis of your doctoral study, knowledge, and scholarship with a significant quantitative research project that contributes to general principles of knowledge in the field(s) potentially affected by the research. A dissertation committee and dissertation chairperson will be established for you in RES 620. Each committee will consist of three faculty members with one member serving as Chair of the Committee. The Chair and two Committee members must be Trident faculty. The chairperson and the committee will be responsible for guiding you during the dissertation process following Trident's Ph.D. Dissertation Handbook.

IRB Application

Pursuant to Federal law and regulations, Institutional Review Board (IRB) approval is required for research involving human subjects. Accordingly, prior to the student conducting research involving human subjects, including the collecting and analyzing of data, the proposed study must be reviewed and approved by the Trident IRB.

Dissertation Timeline

All Doctoral/Ph.D. degree requirements must be fulfilled within up to nine consecutive years. The time to complete the dissertation courses for doctoral students may not exceed three years without written approval by the Director of the Ph.D. program and the College Dean. Students are strongly encouraged to complete the Ph.D. degree within their three-, four-, or five-year track, based on their Academic Plan (AP). Program Special Instructions


- Students must successfully pass the written and oral portions of the Qualifying Exam while enrolled in RES 620 and before enrollment in DBA 699.
- Students who attempt and fail the COB Ph.D. Qualifying Exam twice will be academically disqualified from the program (i.e., will no longer be enrolled in the COB Ph.D. program).
- Students who attempt and conditionally pass the COB Ph.D.
 Qualifying Exam must enroll in and successfully pass RES 699
 (Directed Study in Research Methods) as a pre-requisite for DBA 699. Students who fail RES 699 twice will be academically disqualified from the program.
